Online Registration: Registration for Summer Art Camp will be done primarily online. Paper registration will not be accepted this year. JUNE 7-11 1-4 PM **Introduction to Dungeons & Dragons** (David Daniel) Ages 13-18
Learn how to play Dungeons & Dragons from the ground up, perfect for those who have NEVER played D&D before, and fun for those with experience. Participate in a level 1 through 4 campaign with veteran game master David Daniel, and learn all you need to create characters, slay monsters, and be the hero you always dreamed of becoming.

JUNE 21-25 1-4 PM **Introduction to Game Mastering** (David Daniel) Ages 13-18
Come learn advanced techniques for playing Dungeons and Dragons, with special focus on how to build and run encounters, how to make dungeons and towns, and how to prepare and roleplay Non-Player-Characters. Perfect for those who wish to learn to run the game of D&D for their friends.

JULY 5th-9th 1-4 PM **Worldbuilding for Novelists and GameMasters** (David Daniel) Ages 13-18
In this class taught by local author David M Daniel, participants will learn the common techniques and tricks used by both novelists and game masters to bring fantastic worlds to life, be they teeming with Dragons, or crushed by the forces of a dystopia. This course will focus on deep diving into the various ways to construct a coherent and robust world setting for any work of fiction or gaming participants might be working on or imagining.

JULY 12th-16th

9 AM-12 PM **Basics of Screenwriting** (David Daniel) Ages 13-18

In this class, taught by local author and director David M Daniel, students will learn how to structure the script for a short film. Examine industry standard structures such as 3 Act and Save The Cat, all while working to produce your own short script to be filmed in the second week.

1-4 PM **Basics of Film Equipment and Editing** (David Daniel) Ages 13-18

This class will focus on developing familiarity with various different pieces of video equipment and editing software. Led by PAC-8 instructors, this class serves to help prepare young filmmakers to develop comfort and mastery with the basic tools of modern filmmaking.

JULY 19th-23rd

NOTE: While these two classes are separate they MUST be taken as a single all day course, running from 9 AM to 5 PM with an hour break for lunch.

9 AM- 12PM **Acting for Film** (Teen Center) 13-18

Working with the scripts produced by students in an earlier course, participants will take on roles and learn the basics of acting for camera, with a focus on bringing to life the works produced by earlier students in the historic PAC-8, Teen Center, Youth Activity Center, and Fuller Lodge Art Center Summer Collaboration program. These same students will then appear on film in the afternoon slot class to bring these short films to life.

1-4 PM **Short Film Production** (Teen Center) 13-18

A culmination of the earlier course work, students will work together to direct, perform, and produce the short film scripts produced as part of the historic PAC-8, Teen Center, Youth Activity Center, and Fuller Lodge Art Center Summer Collaboration program. This will include design work, acting, technical work, and costuming. At a later date, participants in this course will have the opportunity to attend an evening showcase of these films presented at the Los Alamos Teen Center, and will have the opportunity to discuss their work on these films. NOTE: This course runs until 5 PM.
